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Notes: A "hash it out" meeting will be held tomorrow to discuss the rankings. All three committees (BPC, FPC, and TPC) used the same rubric, but this year the merging of the three ranking lists was not smooth. The issue is that the top several items were FPC items and outranked most instruction requests. Julia believes that the reason ours ranked higher may be the "life/safety" considerations that come forward in FPC, as well as possible OCR issues. If the rubric needs modification, then the rubric should be adjusted, but FPC wants Julia to express to BPC that we expect our rankings to be considered on the same basis as those from other committees.

A question was raised as to FPC's relationship to the capital projects – is there a committee overseeing them now? YES. There is, at least, an advisory committee. Does that committee have a CSEA rep? Not sure – there should be, but we don't know if/who is on that committee. There should be both a CSEA and a Management Council representative as well as the (legally required) faculty rep to provide input from all segments of the college.
