The Adult Ed and Workforce and Community Education departments have merged into Adult & Community Education (ACE). The phone number for both is now 4500 and the email is ACE@redwoods.edu. The ASC is actively soliciting students to become peer tutors for Spring semester. Students who tutor are required to have an overall 3.0 GPA as well as a 3.0 GPA in the subject they are tutoring, and we will be requesting references from instructors. Our training program for the tutors has been completely overhauled, and tutoring in Spring will be done online through Canvas using the Pisces platform. Students needing tutoring when our CR tutors are not available will be able to access additional tutors through the STAR-CA consortium; STAR-CA tutors are part of the California Community Colleges, and they're accessed using the "Tutoring" or "NetTutor" link in Canvas courses as

The ASC has a number of changes for Spring. Since Math Lab is not being offered any more, we're working with Math faculty to actively recruit students as potential peer tutors for Spring. Writing Assistance will continue to be provided by faculty tutors, although on a somewhat reduced schedule. We're also trying to identify potential tutors for Chemistry, Biology, and other subjects. All tutoring for Spring will be carried out online in Canvas; students will be able to access tutors using the navigation link in Canvas labeled "Tutoring" or "NetTutor". We should have a schedule posted for tutoring on the ASC website by the end of the second week, and it will be sent out college-wide as well. Class attendance in the mandatory classes remain high in the online format. Kristin Chorbi has done an excellent job ensuring that our trainers have what they need in the online environment and the transition from face to face has been successful.

CalWORKs

Fall 2020 enrollment is down, and 11 students have withdrawn during the semester due to various reasons. The counselors, advisors, and staff continue to do all they can to support our students during this challenging time. The CalWORKs Program issued a grant award of \$300.00 to students in order to augment unmet financial need which has not been covered by financial aid, grants and/or scholarships so students can provide for their basic educational needs while working towards self-sufficiency. The academic success and well-being of our students are important to us. We also provided students with transportation grants.

The Growth Resources Outreach Valued & Empowerment (G.R.O.V.E.) Program

This semester, despite the challenges that COVID has had on our homeless and housing insecure students, they continue to show grit, determination, and resiliency towards their academic goals. The GROVE has helped 14 students with financial aid for hotel vouchers, housed 18 students in the Residential Halls, and currently deposits and rental subsidies to 16 students in Fall 2020. We have entered into a partnership with the Arcata House and currently working out the details of an MOU. Some of our students are already with Arcata House staff for wraparound services.

Del Norte and Pelican Bay

The computer labs that had been available for students (by appointment) during the fall semester have been closed due to the escalation of COVID-19 infections in Humboldt and Del Norte Counties. This service was underutilized so the impact does not seem to be significant. The Del Norte campus has no face to face classes this semester so student activity on campus is basically non-existent. At Pelican Bay we have completed spring registration. All but 2 of our 33 sections are full with a waitlist. It is looking like we will have 403 students, including some new, in the spring. Correspondence are going surprisingly well. We also met with some of the EOPS teams this week to nail down what "Above and Beyond" services will look like in the Pelican Bay Scholars Program which already supplies all of the instructional materials required. I am very pleased with the direction this collaboration is going.
