Our online tutoring program is ramping up. Last semester we joined STAR-CA, a consortium of California Community Colleges that are collaborating to provide tutoring online through Canvas. As part of this consortium, we contribute 4-6 hours a week of tutoring time to the consortium's schedule; and in return our students can access over 80 hours of tutor time per week in subjects ranging from Accounting to Statistics. In addition, this semester we are hiring students again to be peer tutors for specific courses, and peer tutoring will be done through Canvas using the same online platform used by the STAR-CA consortium. We are up and running for the Spring Semester. The Guidance classes (145, 146, 147 and 148) are all open for enrollment. We have sent multiple emails to students to remind them of this to try to boost our enrollment. The classes are still on line and at this time, open to all students. We have evening hours (open until 8:00 pm) this semester, Mondays and Thursdays. While we are not yet doing LD testing, students can be referred for an in-depth screening which may result in their ability to receive temporary accommodations. Our Adaptive PE classes are open for enrollment, and are also online. We've created a Welcome to DSPS video that is on our website. Students can watch the entire thing (about 10 minutes) or can just click on specific parts explaining how to apply, how to access the LIGHT Center, how to get counseling and advising. This will also be used as part of our outreach to high schools when we start contacting them. Our staff and faculty did a great job on this project. Also active on our website is Woodley the Chatbot.

Our biggest challenge during this pandemic continues to be keeping students engaged and connected to our services.

Intercollegiate Athletic Conditioning courses are scheduled to resume Feb. 15. We have revised our protocols to follow the latest guidelines of CDC, IHE and the campus requirements for sports conditioning. Currently the status of competition for early spring sports remains uncertain. To this point, the sports of soccer and volleyball have been opted out on by the conference and our programs. Schedules have been revised for remaining sports with a beginning date of March 3 - April 18 if clearance if given. A plan for required testing is in place for students along with the daily

protocols and screenings required if competition resumes. The only sports CR is still currently opted in for early spring are Cross Country and Basketball. The Adult & Community Education Department is happy to welcome Gretchen Johnson to our department as an Instructional Support Specialist II. She is starting Feb. 3rd and will be here 20 hours per week. We have also made changes to the start dates of a couple of our classes to allow students more time to settle into credit classes. EDUC 203 - Getting Started in Online Classes w/Canvas will now run 1/25 - 2/15/2021. We also changed WORK 222 - Communication in the Workplace to run 2/1 - 5/14/2021. Our Medical Assisting class is on track to start on Feb. 22nd; we received 32 applications which allowed us to have a full class of 16 with a waitlist. We will hold informational meetings over Zoom for the Medical Billing & Coding Specialist on Jan. 23rd and Jan. 28th. The Pharmacy Tech info meetings will be held by Zoom as well on 2/6 & 2/18. Students only need to attend one meeting and the link is on our webpage. Again this year we will offer the 40-Hour Wildland Fire School at the Del Norte campus during Spring Break. This is a very low cost class at \$65. and will qualify students to be able to apply for Federal firefighting jobs.

Reminder that once a student applies, it takes 2-3 business days for them to receive their "Welcome" email and of course even longer when there is a Holiday.

Last day to add classes (full term length) is 1/29, that is also the last day to drop and get a refund and NO W grade.

If a student is on a waitlist, the instructor must give grant them permission thru WebAdvisor. Once that has happened, students have 5 days to then login to their own WebAdvisor account, choose "Manage my Waitlist" and add themselves. If they don't register within that 5 days, the only way they can then add the class is for the instructor to re-issue permission again. If a student is not on the waitlist, and they want to add a class, they must contact the instructor directly. IF that instructor allows the add, the instructor must then email the ambassador@redwoods.edu with all pertinent information. We will then add the student, barring any holds.

All student questions, forms and faculty registration issues need to be sent to ambassador@redwoods.edu. This email is monitored by several staff all day long. Side note: We were told by the Business Office that CR will not require students to get parking passes this summer.
