SUBJECT: 2016-17 Noncredit Student Success and Support Program Allocations

2016-17 SSSP Funding: The 2016-17 State Budget maintained Student Success and Support Program (SSSP) funding at prior year levels. \$17,000,000 of this funding is available to California community colleges to provide SSSP noncredit services. SSSP noncredit funds are available to all colleges that submitted a SSSP noncredit funding certification for 2016-2017 and noncredit student headcount data for 2015-16. The 2016-17 allocations were generated by the formula currently in effect, which is based on the 2015-16 weighted noncredit student headcount data submitted.

Allowable Use of Credit SSSP Funds: Colleges receive an allocation of Noncredit SSSP funds for the sole purpose of providing core services to students enrolled in the following noncredit areas:

- Elementary and Secondary Basic Skills
- English as a Second Language
- Short-Term Vocational
- Workforce Preparation

Core services that may be funded include orientation, assessment, counseling, advising, and other education planning services, as well as follow-up interventions for at-risk students (defined as noncredit students who are enrolled in basic skills courses or who have not identified an education goal and course of study). Noncredit SSSP funds are provided to supplement district expenditures for student support and may not supplant or take the place of other resources.

For specific guidance on allowable uses of funds and prohibited expenditures, please refer to the <u>SSSP Handbook</u>, which contains the Funding Guidelines and California Code of Regulations, title 5.

Match Requirements: Colleges are required to spend one dollar of district funds for every one dollar of 2016-17 SSSP funds.

Carryover of Funds: The Chancellor's Office has authorized the carryover of 2016-17 funds through December 31, 2017.

Reporting: As you know, the requirement to submit program plans has temporarily been suspended; however, mid-year and year-end expenditure reporting requirements remain in effect. The Mid-year Expenditure Report for 2016-17 allocations will be due March 2017, and the Year-end Expenditure Report will be due February 2018. Exact dates will be forthcoming.
