

Office of Instruction and Student Development Friday Update: February 17, 2017

Basic Skills Initiative (BSI), Student Equity Program (SE), and Student Success and Support Program (SSSP)

For the past few years, those involved with the BSI, SE and SSSP have been told that the plans driving these initiatives would be integrated in the future. That time has finally arrived. The Chancellor just released an integrated planning template and is requiring that each college submit a 2017-2019 Integrated Plan and a 2017-2018 Integrated Budget Plan by December 2017.

These programs were selected for integrative efforts for two main reasons: 1) all three programs have the same ultimate goal of increasing student success while closing achievement gaps; and 2) there is a strong potential for overlap between and among the programs.

Here is an example of how a planning goal can be integrated across each program:

- Goal: *Increase completion and persistence through the English Developmental Sequence*
 - SSSP Activity: *Provide extended orientation and assessment prep courses/workshops*
 - Student Equity Activity: *Provide extended orientation and assessment prep courses/workshops*
 - BSI Activity: *Pilot prep courses through the first year programs or specific bridge program*

The Chancellor's Office is creating an online portal that colleges will use to submit their information. Colleges are no longer required to submit extensive datasets, but they must still use data and information related to disproportionate impacts to inform their plans.

Inter-District Transfer Agreements in K-12

Academy of the Redwoods (AR) Principal, Luke Biesecker, provided an update about K-12 inter-district transfer agreements. At this point, Eureka City Schools (ECS) has indicated a commitment to continuing open enrollment practices with the Fortuna Union High School District (FUHSD) for at least one more year – AR enrollment should not be impacted and Eureka area students can continue to seek out our unique program for next school year.

School district superintendents from across Humboldt County met this last Thursday and “agreed to recommend to their respective boards that no changes for the 2017-18 school year be made to the current countywide enrollment agreement.”
