- 3) Practice using professional business language. Try out new words and relate them to real life things. This will increase the value of this class for you personally.
- 4) Ask others for help. If possible, form a study team. Quiz one another. Practice your presentation in front of others and ask for honest feedback. It is even good to practice in front of someone who is not in the class to test your ability to convey information in an understandable way.
- 5) Learn the dance of participation. Learn when it is appropriate to Step Up and when you need to Step Back. If you are a quiet person by nature, challenge yourself to ask more questions in class. If you are an enthusiastic participant by nature, practice active listening and step back now and then so others will step up. Be a mentor. Lead by example.

Course Assignments

Current Events

Students will present 5 current events throughout the semester. (10 points each/ 50 points total)

A written one page summary will be presented and will include responses to the following questions:

- 1) What article did you read? (Title, Source, Date)
- 2) What interested you in this article?
- 3) How does it connect to concepts covered in the textbook? Cite specific concepts.
- 4) What did you learn?
- 5) What do you want to know more about? What questions do you have now?

Personal Finance Budget : (50 points)

Students will complete a personal budget. This activity is designed to enhance student's awareness of how to manage their personal finances and create a realistic spending plan. (50 points)

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New Business Venture Project: (200 points total)

Working in teams is essential in the business world today. To simulate this experience, students will join or be assigned to a team with 3-5 peers. In brief, the new venture project will consist of the following sub-components:

- Team Contract: Each team will discuss team member strengths and negotiate a division of duties. They will put this agreement in writing, sign it, and deliver a copy of that agreement to me. (25 points)
- Executive Summary: Each team will write a 2 page (500 word) executive summary describing their new venture and the opportunities and challenges associated with it. Teams will swap executive summaries and will participate in a constructive critique exercise. Then each team will receive a critique and may use that to revise and re-submit their final draft. (75 points)
- Business Venture Presentation: Each team will present an oral presentation about their new business venture including how their product or service will fill a need or want and the highlights of the startup costs and income projections. Visual aids are required. All team members must speak during the presentation. (75 points)
- Peer Reviews. Members of your New Venture Team will grade your participation during the project. Their evaluation of your contribution could change your project grade, which will affect your final course grade. (25 points)

Tests – (100 points each/500 points total)

There will be 5 tests covering five sections of the textbook. Each test will be worth up to 100 points. One test will be a take home, open-book exam. In class exams will not be open book but one page of notes will be allowed

Tests will cover main concepts, business terminology, and will require students to understand concepts well enough to provide and/or analyze a real life example or case study.

Class Participation (200 points)]

Active participation in class is a major part of the learning experience. Participation points will be earned by doing the following: showing up, maintaining professional language and demeanor, listening actively to others, engaging in classroom discussions and activities, completing assignments on time and coming prepared to learn (i.e. do your reading!)
