Canvas Quizzes: (Over 200 points possible, thus 20% of your final grade) These will be mostly multiple choice and numerical quizzes. You will get 3 attempts on each quiz. Unless otherwise noted, there will be Canvas quizzes due every Monday night at 11:55 pm.

In-Class Exams: (300 points possible, thus 30% of your final grade.) We will have two in-class exams worth 100 points each and one final exam, also worth 100 points. The questions will be mostly multiple choice and numeric and will look a lot like the Canvas quizzes. You can use any and all handwritten notes for the in-class exams.

New Venture Project: (500 points, thus 50% of your final grade.) The requirements for the New Venture project and related assignments will be detailed in class and in handouts. The basic idea of the paper is that you'll be working in

groups of 3 or 4 students to come up with an idea for a hypothetical new business, research its viability, and plan for overcoming the obstacles you expect to encounter. At the end of the semester, each team will be required to make a formal presentation of their proposal to the class.
