# **Course Description**

A competency-based course emphasizing the integration of academic reading and writing skills. Students develop reading strategies necessary for academic reading and write extended formal paragraphs and reading-based expository essays. The lab component is scheduled in the Writing Center where students receive essential tutorial support in reading, writing, and sentence skills.

# **Student Learning Outcomes**

1. After a close reading of a nonfiction text, write a unified, coherent essay that develops a thesis with general and specific support.

2. Identify the main ideas and their development in academically appropriate nonfiction texts.

3. Adhere to standard English conventions in writing with special attention to sentence boundaries.

4. Employ the Writing Center to support basic academic behavior necessary to college success.

- 5. You must submit the final portfolio in order to earn a passing grade in the class.
