Students analyze issues and claims presented in visual, oral or written arguments and write analytical and argumentative essays based on those issues. Close analytical reading and sustained written response to complex argumentative texts is required as preparation for English 1A.

- 2. Critically read and respond to argumentative texts.
- 3. Generate and organize general and specific support for a thesis.
- 4. Lab: Use feedback to support reflective learning, academic inquiry, reading, writing, revision, grammar and proofreading skills.
