Late Work Point Deduction

Grading Components

1. Journal Entries 6 pts each - 66 pts total

Your 11 journal entries provide an opportunity to explore in writing your thoughts and feelings as you experiment with the success strategies presented in **On Course**. By carefully examining strategies in your journal, you will discover which ones will assist you to create a rich, personally fulfilling life. **Although I will look through what you write, please write your journals for yourself, not for me.** Journal Entries are submitted electronically through MyCR under the Assignments tab.

It is not my intention to read and comment on every journal entry you write. Instead, I will look through your journal entries to verify the completion of each assignment and to give credit for a job well done. However, I will read occasional entries just to get a sense of the issues you are working on. With this knowledge I can be of greater assistance to you this semester. If you want my comment on a specific journal entry, just let me know with a note in the student text box when you submit your journal entry.

Journal Points: Each journal entry can be awarded up to 6 points. A journal entry will be awarded the maximum points if it is complete (all steps in the directions have been responded to) and there is evidence of an attempt to **Dive Deep. Grammar, spelling, and punctuation will <u>NOT</u> be factors in awarding points for journal entries.** Feel free to express yourself without concern for Standard English conventions.

2. Discussion Forums 3 pts each - 18 pts total

For full credit, you are required to **respond fully to the prompt and to 2 classmates**. All forum postings should be a minimum of **50 words** long. Submitting forum prompt responses ahead of due date is encouraged and allows other students time to read what you wrote and respond to it. **Extra credit** is available for this. Grading details are posted in the Forums module in MyCR along with a Response Rubric.

Forum Extra Credit Points:

Students can earn up to **2 extra credit points** in each discussion forum.

<u>1 extra point</u> - Post your response to the forum **one week before the due date**. For a due date of Friday at 11 pm, you need to post your response by the Friday before at 11 pm for 1 extra credit point.

<u>1 extra point</u> – Post **1 additional student response** after the required 2 classmate responses. Responding to classmates forum responses and to classmates who have responded to you are acceptable forms of earning extra credit.

3. Student Education Plan 8 pts total

A SEP is an **individualized plan of courses** that provide a "master list" of the courses and prerequisites that you will need to obtain a certificate, associate degree or may include a plan for transferring to a university system to earn a bachelor's degree. Details including a list of current CR counselors/advisors are posted in the Assignments module in MyCR.

4. College Graduate Interview Essay or PowerPoint Presentation 8 pts total Write a **3-page reflection paper** or a **PowerPoint Presentation** based on an **interview** conducted with **college graduate**. Students will arrange the in-person, phone, video or email interview and decide what questions they want to ask. Details are posted in the Assignments module in MyCR.
