Course Description (catalog description as described in course outline): MATH-376 Math Lab for Pre – algebra mathematics (0.5-1.0 units LAB) P/NP only. A course which offers review of mathematical topics for students enrolled in any Math 376 Pre – algebra mathematics course. This lab will provide individualized instruction in a self-paced lab environment. This course is designed to support Math 376 classes. Note: Students should be enrolled in a Math 376 section to utilize the services of the Math 376 supplementary lab class. Every .5 unit of LAB requires 27 hours (45/2 actual 60/2-minute hours is equivalent to 54/2 "classroom" 50/2-minute hours).
