Catalog Description

A support course for Math 15, "Introduction to Statistics." Through hands-on activities and group work, students learn skills and explore concepts crucial for success in transfer-level statistics. Note: This course is intended for students concurrently enrolled in Math 15, "Introduction to Statistics."

Course Student Learning Outcomes (from course outline of record)

- 1. Engage productively in real-time interactive collaboration (small group and whole group) through conversation and application to explore statistical concepts
- 2. Apply numerical and algebraic techniques to understand and evaluate statistical formulas.
- 3. Implement effective learning strategies for academic and affective domain challenges.

Prerequisites/co-requisites/ recommended preparation

This is a linked support lab for students enrolled in Math 15 Statistics. Since this course is only offered as a linked support course with Math 15, all Math 15 objectives and outcomes are supported by this course.

Evaluation & Grading Policy

The supplemental section of statistics course is graded as either pass or no pass, to pass, the following conditions must be met:

- 2. You need to have an attendance of at least 70%, and while present, should engage in the various activities.
