Course Description

A course focusing on the scientific study of behavior and mental processes. Explores major theories and concepts, methods, and research findings in psychology. Topics include biological foundations, perception, learning, cognition, emotion, motivation, development, personality, social psychology, psychological disorders and therapies, and applied psychology. This course is transferable to four-year colleges and is a prerequisite for most upper division psychology courses.

- 1. Explain concepts in areas of psychological theory and research while representing the context of historical trends in psychology.
- 3. Demonstrate critical thinking skills and information competence as applied to psychological topics.
- 2. Recognize the impact of diversity on psychological research, including: Age, race, ethnicity, culture, gender, socio-economic status, disability, and sexual orientation.
- 4. Analyze how experience, culture, learning and biology affect behavior and cognitive processes.

Participation (100 points)

Attendance and participation in lecture will contribute 100 points toward your final grade. Students are **allowed 1 unexcused absence**; 20 points will be subtracted from the participation grade for each unexcused absence after the first. Research Summary (100 points)

To fulfill the writing component of this course, you will be asked to complete a **research summary** in which you critically evaluate research in psychology. The first draft (worth 25 points) will be graded on *completeness*; the second draft (worth 75 points) will be graded on *accuracy and writing quality*. Papers should be typed and turned in at the *beginning of lecture* on the due date. Late assignments may be eligible for partial credit if arrangements are made within one week.

Exams (300 points)

There will be one **midterm** (worth 100 points) and a **cumulative final** (worth 200 points). Exams cover material from online lectures and class discussions. Once scores have been entered, I do not allow students to keep exams; but feel free to visit them during office hours if you wish to review your work. Exam review materials can be found on Canvas.
