Grading Standards

Assignments Tab: All assignments are under the “ASSIGNMENTS” tab in Canvas. This includes all quizzes and discussion forums. There are no modules to guide you, the assignments tab will be your guide on what to do and when it is due.

Chapter Quizzes (Worth 15 points each and 240 Total Points)

There are 16-chapter quizzes worth 15 points each for 240 total points. You will have **20 minutes** to answer **15 multiple choice questions**. The quizzes will be based on the textbook readings, supplemental readings and PowerPoints. The quizzes must be completed on this courses Canvas site and is **located under the “Quizzes” tab**. Quizzes will be due by **11:00pm** on the day that it is due. Please see the schedule to see the chapter quizzes due dates. Every week’s quiz will be open on the Sunday of that week. You will be able to see the answers to the quizzes after the due date of the quiz has passed.

- You must start the quiz by **10:35pm** on the day that the quiz is due. If you start the quiz after 10:35, you will have less time to complete the quiz because Moodle will close the quiz exactly at **11:00pm** and only the questions you answered will be submitted and counted.
- You will have **20 minutes** to respond to **15 randomly selected multiple-choice questions** on the chapter readings for the week. You will get only **1 attempt** to take this quiz. You **CANNOT retake** the quiz.
- You will find that you must read the chapter before taking the quizzes. There is not enough time to look up answers in the textbook and/or on google. Please note: Canvas tracks your progress through quizzes. So please do not email me and say that you took the quiz when you didn’t. Rarely do students have technical difficulties. However, if you do, email me immediately and before the deadline and I will get back to you within 24 hours with assistance.)
- If you do not take and/or finish in time, **you will not be allowed to have extended time or allowed to make up a quiz**. This guideline is in place in order to be fair and equal to the rest of the students in the course. If you miss a quiz, I have included an extra credit quiz due on the last day of class to make up those points that were missed.
- **Extra Credit Quiz:** The last quiz is a 15-point extra credit quiz and will include selected topics from chapters 19-24. I have included this quiz so that students who miss a quiz for any reason can make up those points and students who don’t miss a quiz can add to their point total. The selected topics will be on a PowerPoint located in the PowerPoints file “Chapters 19-24”. This quiz is due at 11:00pm, Thursday of week 8.
- **Do not wait until the last hour to take the quiz** in case any technical difficulties arise. You will not be able to make up the quiz because of technical issues unless most of the students in the course run into the same issues.

Syllabus Quiz (worth 5 points total): There is a syllabus quiz is due by the Friday of the first week of class by 11:00pm on Canvas. You will have 30 minutes to answer 8 multiple choice questions having to do with the contents in this syllabus. You can retake the quiz 10 times and you must get a 100% to get 5 points of credit. Only your highest attempt will be counted. If you do not get 100%, you will get 0 points.

Discussion Forums (Worth 20 Points Each & 160 Total Points)

There will be 8 discussion forums posted on the Canvas class page on topics having to do with lifespan development. The discussion forum will include questions that you will have to answer in the forum and you must reply to at least 1 other students post to receive full credit. Posting answers to the discussion forum topics will be worth 10 points and replying to another student’s post will be worth another 10 points. There will be a total of 4 discussion forums for a total of 80 points. Each discussion forum post must be at least **350 words** and each discussion forum reply must be at

least **200 words**. You will not receive any credit if your posts and replies are not at the minimum word length. The discussion forums are located on the “discussions” tab of the CANVAS class site. Please read the discussion forum rubric located on the first discussion forum “**introductions**” in order to be aware of discussion forum etiquette. Violation of discussion forum etiquette may lead to disciplinary action.

- **Location:** The forums are located on the “**discussions**” tab of the Canvas course site. Please **read the forum rubric** located on this courses Canvas site so you can be aware of forum etiquette. **Violation of forum etiquette and the CR code of conduct may lead to a reduction of points and/or disciplinary action.**
- **Format:** The format for each forum must be in essay format. You may answer the questions individually in separate paragraphs or in one paragraph. **All paragraphs** must be at least **4 intricate sentences** (i.e. no 4-word sentences). You may also include bulleted points or a numbered list in your posts and replies. Remember, your initial post must be at least 350 words and your reply to another person’s post must be at least 200 words.
- **Due date and time:** Forum posts must be added to the forum by **11:00pm on the Saturday of the week** (Except discussion forum #1 which is due on Wednesday June 5th at 11:00pm and discussion forum #8 which is due Thursday at 11:00pm on week 8) that the forum post appears, otherwise you won’t be able to post to the discussion forum and it will not be graded and you will receive a “O.” Remember do not wait until the last hour in case technical difficulties arise. **Do not wait until the last hour to post to the discussion forum** in case any technical difficulties arise.

Discussion Forum Format:

Discussion Forum Posts

- The format for each forum must be in essay format. You may answer the questions to the discussion forum topic in separate paragraphs. All paragraphs must be at least 4 intricate sentences (i.e. no 4-word sentences). You may also include bulleted points or a numbered list in your posts and replies. Your discussion forum post must be at least **350 words**.
- **You must also ask at least 1 question to all of your fellow students** relating to the week’s discussion forum topic in your **initial discussion forum post**. The questions should be worded to allow the other students in the class to think about the topic with more depth and understanding to provide a talking point for student replies. Do not post questions to individual students in your initial discussion forum post, but you can ask another student a question in your replies.

Discussion Forum Replies

- You must also reply to another student’s post. Replying to another student’s post will be worth **10 points** and must be **at least 200 words**. You can ask another student questions in your replies, but it is not required. Feel free to reply to multiple student’s posts and reply as much as you like.
- Remember, your entire post must be at least 350 words and your replies must be at least 200 words.
- **Due:** Discussion forum posts and replies must be added to the forum by **11:00pm on the Saturday of the week** (Except the first week’s discussion forum) that the forum post appears, otherwise it will not be graded and you will receive a “O.” Remember do not wait until the last minute in case technical difficulties arise.
- **Notice:** Every student in the course and the instructor can read your forum posts. Think carefully about what you would like people to see or if your comments be would insensitive or inappropriate. Insensitive and inappropriate language or content violates SOU policy and you may face disciplinary action if you do write those types of remarks.
- Insensitive and inappropriate language or content violates CR policy and you may face disciplinary action if you do write those types of remarks.
