Assignment Descriptions

Writing/Research

Research Questions 50 points- This activity will be a worksheet for you to exercise your understanding between qualitative and quantitative research questions. You will then be directed to write down two research questions, one qualitative, one quantitative. The qualitative question will be the question you answer throughout the semester in your Method, Results, Discussion paper and your research paper.

APA Style Quiz 50 points –This quiz will consist of short answer and multiple-choice questions asking you to demonstrate your working knowledge of writing in APA style, properly citing sources, and formatting paragraphs.

Annotated Bibliography (50 points each) – In this assignment you will be asked to cite articles in APA format. The Annotated Bibliography form and article to be cited will be provided to you by the instructor based on your chosen theme/theory Under each citation you will summarize the content of each article.

Literature Review 100 points – In this assignment you will use the same information gathered from the three articles used in the annotated bibliography assignments. However, in this assignment the information will be written in an essay format comparing and contrasting the articles. The finished assignment should be 4-6 pages in length. A sample will be provided to you by your instructor.

Method, Results, & Discussion (100 points) In this assignment you will continue the process of writing a research paper. Up until this point you will have written a literature review, the first half of a research paper. To complete this assignment, you will explain the method you used to gather data. Many of you will be completing an autoethnographic research paper. That means you will explain in the *method* section that you collected data from your own story and describe your demographics. However if you choose to complete an interview of someone else's story you would describe that in the method section, sharing their demographics. The *results* section of this paper will be the story/experience that you are going to analyze. It is important to share the story as it happened without any analysis, only the details belong in the results section. The *discussion* section is where the analysis of that story belongs. This is where you have freedom to complete you own analysis and compare and contrast the experience with that described in the literature you read. You will be provided an example paper by your instructor. This paper should be 4-6 pages in length.

Research Paper (100 points) The final research paper will include your previously written literature review followed by your Method, Results, and Discussion paper. You are expected to correct any errors and incorporate feedback given to you from the previous assignments. You will add one final paragraph, the *Conclusion*, tying all of your paper together, resulting in a complete 8-12 page APA style Research paper.

Exams & Quizzes

Midterm (150 pt)

The midterm exam will include 75 multiple choice questions on chapters 1-7.

Final Exam(150 pt)

The final exam will include 75 multiple choice questions on chapters 8-15.

Chapter activity/quizzes (150 points) Each chapter will have a corresponding quiz consisting of 10 multiple choice questions. You are welcome and encouraged to write any thoughts, comments or questions you have about the chapter at the end of these quizzes. In lieu of the quiz you may write a journal entry reflecting on the chapter. To get full points for the journal entry you must include 1. What you found interesting, 2. Why it was interesting, and 3. How it applies to a "reality" situation This can be your own experience, the experience of a character in a movie, or a friend(application is what I am looking for here).
