Catalog Description

Topics include prenatal, infant, child, adolescent, and adult development.

Assignment Descriptions

Writing/Research

Story of Change (50 points) Write a story from your own life where you noticed that your behavior/beliefs/temperament changed. This should be about 2 pages long. In later assignments you will be analyzing this story through a developmental theory. Please only share what you are comfortable sharing. You do not have to write about anything stressful or emotional but you can if you want to. This can be a simple story of how you liked to play with dolls as a kid but when you grew up you preferred to spend time in sports. It can be a story about how peer pressure influenced risky behaviors as a teen. It could be a story of how a relationship changed the way you view love/family/community. It is important in this story to try to not analyze why you changed but just describe the change that happened. We will analyze in a later assignment.

Annotated Bibliographies (60 points each, 120 points total) In this assignment you will be asked to cite articles in APA format. The Annotated Bibliography form and article to be cited will be provided to you. Under each citation you will summarize the content of each article.

Theme/Theory/Discussion (50 points) Describe the selected theories (Erikson & Bronfenbrenner) in detail in your own words. Then analyze your story of change through the lens of this theory.

Literature Review (150 points) – In this assignment you will use the same information gathered from the three articles used in the annotated bibliography assignments. However, in this assignment the information will be written in an essay format comparing and contrasting the articles. The finished assignment should be 4-6 pages in length. A sample will be provided to you by your instructor.

Research Paper (150 points) The final research paper will include your previously written literature review followed by a Method section, the Results(story of change assignment), and Discussion(analysis of story of change). You are expected to correct any errors and incorporate feedback given to you from the previous assignments. You will add one final paragraph, the *Conclusion*, tying all of your paper together, resulting in a complete 8-12 page APA style Research paper.

Exams & Quizzes

Midterm (100pt)

The midterm exam will include 100 multiple choice questions on chapters 1-9.

Final Exam(100pt)

The final exam will include 500. multiple choice questions on chapters 10-17.

Chapter quizzes/reflection (250 points) Each chapter will have a corresponding quiz consisting of 10-15 multiple choice questions. You are welcome and encouraged to write any thoughts, comments or questions you have about the chapter at the end of these quizzes.

APA Quiz questions (50 points total) The first 10 chapter quizzes/reflections will include a question on APA formatting to brush up your APA skill before writing your research paper. They will be worth 5 points per question, totaling in 50 points for the semester.
